# THE ORGANISATION

The Fairtrade global trading system is engineered for inclusive growth outcomes to enable all farmers and workers to have sustainable livelihoods, thus the freedom to decide their own futures. We are best known as the independent, not-for-profit body behind the Fairtrade Mark, which is the most recognized & trusted ethical label in the world.

Fairtrade ANZ is governed by a Board of Directors and is a member of Fairtrade International, a global network of producers and workers in 75 countries who are half owners & Fairtrade products are sold in 125 countries. Transforming trade to create a fair future with social justice and respect for the dignity of every person is at the core of Fairtrade's approach. That starts with paying fair prices and pushing for decent livelihoods for all farmers and workers and working systemically to ensure that supply chains are sustainable and transparent.

The global Fairtrade network includes farmer and worker cooperatives in Africa, Asia-Pacific and Latin America/Caribbean. As co-owners of the global Fairtrade system, worth over \$15 million USD in annual retail sales of 11,000 products; small producers occupy half the global board and General Assembly where all critical strategic, financial and risk decisions are taken. In Fairtrade, small producers and workers not only own the coffee or cotton they produce – but they own the only globally scaled comprehensive trading system engineered to make trade fair for everyone.

We are a global system that supports companies to act faster and transparently, farmers and workers to benefit more, and consumers to act directly to support producers to create a fair & sustainable future.

In 2021, Fairtrade International and Fairtrade ANZ embarked on an ambitious new five-year strategy to empower consumers and businesses to choose fair.

The Monitoring, Evaluation and Learning (MEL) Lead establishes and ensures the smooth running of all MEL systems across the organisation; leads the organisation's research, evaluation and learning activities; and provides an organisation-wide view of our internal performance in programmes by consolidating data sets from across the organisation to support organisational decision making, as well as donor reporting. ## Key Tasks and Responsibilities

## The MEL Lead will:

- Develop and manage the organisational implementation of Monitoring, Evaluation and Learning systems
- Management of baseline, indicator and target development, and monitoring frameworks for all producer support-implemented projects
- Support all teams to develop programme-specific monitoring and evaluation frameworks as needed
- Management of all producer facing research, impact and evaluation projects
- Build capacity and ensure understanding of staff and volunteers in correctly implementing MEL systems and utilise MEL data to inform programme implementation and development.
- Oversee pacific communications strategy, content creation and liaison with internal teams and external partners
- Support the development of resources to demonstrate Fairtrade's impact (reports, article and videos)

### Under the overall guidance of the manager, the MEL Lead will:

- Oversee producer support services for selected Pacific products and countries
- Support the implementation of donor-funded producer support projects, with a focus on overseeing the Fairtrade Co-Investment Fund
- Assist the Producer Support team in ensuring the quality of periodic progress reports as well as annual work plans and activity schedules
